


# Welcome to the Cathedral Church of All Saints

## **Prelude**

### **Territorial Acknowledgement**

### **The Lighting of the Advent Wreath with the Christmas Candle**

**Reader:**



On this Holy Night we join the circle of our wreath with the candles of HOPE, LOVE, PEACE, and JOY. May the light of their flames cast away all doubts and fears in us and affirm God's promises of old.

Tonight, we light our center candle as a sign that your promises have been fulfilled.



**Reader:**

“To you is born this day, in the city of David a Savior who is Christ the Lord.” Tonight we celebrate the birth of Jesus, which transforms us and our world.

**Reader:**

[The center candle is lit.] May the light of this flame at the center of our wreath proclaim to one and all that Jesus has come to be at the center of our lives.

**ALL:**

**Thanks be to God! Light in the midst of us, center of our story, give us courage to share your message of Hope, to live your example of Love, to strive for Peace within ourselves and in our world, and to celebrate with Joy the glory of this Christmas. Amen.**

**Reader:**

Let us hear, and heed, in Holy Scripture the story of God's loving purpose from the time of our rebellion against him until the glorious redemption brought to us by his holy Child Jesus, and let us make this place glad with carols of praise.

But first, let us pray for the needs of his whole world, for peace and justice on earth, for the unity and mission of the Church for which he died, for our forgiveness and our ability to forgive others, and especially for this country and this municipality of Halifax.

And because he particularly loves them, let us remember in his name those who are poor and helpless, those who are cold, hungry, or oppressed; those who are sick and those who mourn; those who feel lonely or unloved; the aged and little children, as well as those who do not know the love of the Lord Jesus Christ. Finally, let us remember before God his pure and lowly Mother, and that whole multitude which no one can number, whose hope was in



the Word made flesh, and with whom, in Jesus, we are one for evermore. **Amen.**

# God Creates the Heaven and the Earth

## Reader:

In the day that the Lord God made the earth and the heavens, when no plant of the field was yet in the earth and no herb of the field had yet sprung up— then the Lord God formed man from the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and the man became a living being.

And the Lord God planted a garden in Eden, in the east; and there he put the man whom he had formed. Out of the ground the Lord God made to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food, the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

Then the Lord God said, 'It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner.' So out of the ground the Lord God formed every animal of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called each living creature, that was its name. The man gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every animal of the field; but for the man there was not found a helper as his partner.

So the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then he took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. And the rib that the Lord God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man. Then the man said, 'This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called Woman, for out of Man this one was taken.'



**Reader:**

O God, in creating man and woman you infused us with the very breath of your Spirit. In the wonder of your breath-taking creation – of all that is: seen and unseen; galaxies, stars, suns, and this precious earth; we stand in humbled awe. Help us open ourselves to you, more and more, until we blossom into the fullness of your image. Let all the earth and the heavens above rejoice with us this night, in thanksgiving for your eternal love. Amen

**Hymn** Of the Father's Love Begotten (vv. 1-3)

Of the Father's love begotten  
ere the worlds began to be,  
he is Alpha and Omega,  
he the source, the ending he,  
of the things that are, that have been,  
and that future years shall see  
evermore and evermore.

Oh, that birth forever blessed  
when the virgin, full of grace,  
by the Holy Ghost conceiving,  
bore the Savior of our race,  
and the babe, the world's Redeemer,  
first revealed his sacred face

This is he whom seers and sages  
sang of old with one accord,  
whom the voices of the prophets

## God's Prophets tell of a new Creation

### Reader:

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins.

A voice cries out: 'In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.'

A voice says, 'Cry out!' And I said, 'What shall I cry?' All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field. The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the Lord blows upon it; surely the people are grass.

The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand for ever. Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, 'Here is your God!'

See, the Lord God comes with might, and his arm rules for him; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him. He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms, and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep.

### Reader:

Isaiah offers words of comfort to a nation overcome with despair. Dreams lost, lives scattered, futures clouded with



uncertainty, they find themselves like aimless wanderers in desert places. "No one hears - no one cares, what does my life matter"? But as the darkness seems deepest before the dawn; so our God journeys with us through our times of trial to the edge of new horizons.

While shepherds watched their flocks by night  
All seated on the ground  
The angel of the Lord came down  
And glory shone around

"Fear not", said she, for mighty dread  
Had seized their troubled mind  
"Glad tidings of great joy I bring  
To you and humankind"

"To you, in David's town this day  
Is born of David's line  
The Savior who is Christ the Lord  
And this shall be the sign"

"The heavenly Babe you there shall find  
To human view displayed  
All meanly wrapped in swathing bands  
And in a manger laid"

## **Foretelling the Birth of the Messiah**

### **Reader:**

Again the Lord spoke to Ahaz, saying, Ask a sign of the Lord your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven. But Ahaz said, I will not ask, and I will not put the Lord to the test. Then Isaiah said: 'Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary mortals, that you weary my God also?



Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Immanuel. He shall eat curds and honey by the time he knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good. For before the child knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good, the land before whose two kings you are in dread will be deserted. The Lord will bring on you and on your people and on your ancestral house such days as have not come since the day that Ephraim departed from Judah.'

### **Reader:**

We can communicate without moving our lips, unseen, with people around the globe. In instant messages, we Tweet, Text, TikTok, Tumblr, Instagram, and Snapchat; yet we are still so deaf to your attempts to speak to us. In all the ways God might have confronted us; forcing us to sit up and take notice you choose to speak one word: "Immanuel". A word which says; "I am with you, around you, within you" - Always, and forever.

### **Hymn**    Away in A Manger

Away in a manger, no crib for a bed,  
The little Lord Jesus laid down his sweet head.  
The stars in the bright sky looked down where he lay,  
The little Lord Jesus asleep on the hay.

The cattle are lowing, the baby awakes,  
But little Lord Jesus, no crying he makes.  
I love thee, Lord Jesus! look down from the sky,  
And stay by my cradle till morning is nigh.

Be near me, Lord Jesus; I ask thee to stay  
Close by me forever, and love me I pray.  
Bless all the dear children in thy tender care,  
And fit us for heaven to live with thee there.



## Mary says Yes to God

### **Reader:**

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, 'Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you.' But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be.

The angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob for ever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.'

Mary said to the angel, 'How can this be, since I am a virgin?' The angel said to her, 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. For nothing will be impossible with God.' Then Mary said, 'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.' Then the angel departed from her.

### **Reader:**

Why Mary? A young woman of no account, no "good family" status, no fine home in the suburbs, no designer gowns or sequined sandals; yet God chose her to help change



the world. “Here am I, the servant of the Lord”, says Mary. Is that what it takes to give birth to possibilities beyond our wildest imagining? What might happen if we, like Mary, voiced those words “God, let it be with me according to your word.”

**Hymn** O Little town of Bethlehem (vv. 1-3)

1 O little town of Bethlehem,  
how still we see thee lie!  
Above thy deep and dreamless sleep  
the silent stars go by;  
yet in thy dark streets shineth

# The Birth of Jesus

## Reader:

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son, wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

## Reader:

Emperor Augustus was busy counting heads. “There is Money to be made in taxing every man and woman in my kingdom”, he was thinking. God was busy looking beyond the numbers. God saw names, with faces; with stories and histories and relationships. And so God came to be with the people. Not to extract a tax, but to offer a gift; to feed us with the abundance of his love. To a town called ‘Bethlehem’ he came, which, in the Hebrew language, means: “the house of bread”. “I am the bread of life”, Jesus would one day tell his friends. “Those who believe in me will never be hungry”.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, ‘Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.’ And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

**‘Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favours!’**

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, ‘Let us go now to Bethlehem



and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us.' So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

O God when the time was ripe you once more gifted us with the wonder of your creativity. Nurtured in the womb of Mary by the Holy Spirit, you came to us in the innocence and vulnerability of a child. Cradled by lowly beasts, kept warm by their presence, and guarded by the compassion of Joseph, you fulfilled this night, the promises you had made known through the prophets of old. Human as we are, you came, willing to risk being dependent upon our human care and love.

**Round yon virgin mother and child, Holy infant so tender and mild...**

Humble, gentle, and unassuming was his coming, yet kings were moved to seek him, while other rulers were troubled by the news of his birth. On this Holy Night we rejoice in this child in whom the fullness of your love was manifest. The very Word of God made flesh, full of grace and truth, born to deliver us from our sins, and redeem us from the powers of evil and terminal death. To save us from ourselves you chose to come down from heaven as one of us.

**Sleep in heavenly peace,  
Sleep in heavenly peace.**

As he grew among us Jesus showed in loving those often unnoticed and forgotten by this world, the power that lies within us to transform life. Jesus took his message even to the cross where he would die, proclaiming in his great sacrifice the power of unconditional forgiveness. Yet death could not silence your Word, and in rising again he took his place at your right hand proclaiming justice and



peace shall know no bounds. Your greatest gift to us, O God, came wrapped in swaddling clothes.

By the power of your Spirit sanctify this bread and wine, your heavenly banquet shared with us, transforming them into the Body and Blood of our Christ. We gather together no longer as strangers on this night, but as your family. We remember how Jesus, with his friends, took bread, blessed, and broke it, and shared it among them, saying; "Take and eat, this is my body, offered for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper, Jesus raised a cup of wine, blessed it, shared it, one to another, saying: "Drink this, all of you; my blood is poured out for you and for all humankind for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me."
