The Outreach Committee plays a leadership role in directing resources towards worthwhile projects. In addition, various groups and individuals within the Cathedral community champion projects, sometimes with help from the congregation and sometimes discretely. Many individuals are leaders and active citizens within the broader community, contributing to the outreach capacity of the Cathedral family. As a congregational priority, the Outreach Ministry is inter-generational and responsive to many needs.
